INTRODUCTION TO HAUSCR

The Harvard College Association for U.S.-China Relations (HAUSCR) is an organization (501(c)3 federal tax-exempt organization) dedicated to promoting the exchange of ideas and opportunities between students from Harvard University and from all across China. Each year, HAUSCR organizes a series of cross-cultural exchange programs in Harvard, Beijing, and Shanghai, including Harvard's largest summer program in China, collectively changing the lives of over 1,500 students annually around the globe.

HAUSCR's flagship program, the annual HAUSCR Summit for Young Leaders in China (HSYLC), is a week of exploration and development for Chinese high-school students conducted by Harvard undergraduates, faculty, and prominent leaders from both nations. In the US, HAUSCR promotes cross-cultural connections with the ATVenture program, the premier social entrepreneurship competition for Chinese college students.

As China is becoming increasingly important in the global economic stage, we want to help shape new young social entrepreneurs who are capable of helping to improve the society for all. We believe socially-conscious entrepreneurs can help redefine communities and improve the lives of many throughout the world.

Our mission is to inspire change and globalize grassroots entrepreneurship. To accomplish this, we are inviting 20-30 teams of innovative college students from the US and overseas in China to participate in the 2nd annual ATVenture conference and competition. At the conference, participants will get a chance to speak with prominent leaders and academics in the social entrepreneurship field.
