Teaching and Learning

Our programmes are renowned for their rigorous and intellectually challenging content, and at the centre of our ethos is the individualised nature of Cambridge teaching.

The focus of a Cambridge education is on depth of knowledge, cultivating critical thinking and independent study, not simply on contact hours.

Over four weeks you'll immerse yourself in a subject area of your choice and, working one-to-one with an academic expert, produce a body of high-quality research work.

We offer you a choice of two streams on the programme: the Open Stream and the Subject Stream.

On both streams you'll have 2 sessions each week individually with your supervisor who will guide your project, challenge you academically and support your work.

The key difference: on the Open Stream you propose your own research project while on the Subject Stream you choose from one of our proposed topic areas and research questions.

The Open Stream

Remember that if we don't offer your area of interest on the Subject Stream, you can propose almost any project on the Open Stream instead.

It's the perfect option if you have a good sense of what you'd like to research as it puts ownership of your project proposal in your hands.


When deciding on a research topic, we suggest you aim for something where you already have some background knowledge. It could be related to your major area of study or part of a subject you've studied in the past.

This doesn't preclude you from studying something new, just make sure you read some relevant publications before filling out your project form. That way you can show a sound understanding of the subject area you want to explore.

The beauty of the Open Stream is that once you start the topic may develop and lead you in quite a different direction to the one you first envisaged.

For many it's one of the most exciting and rewarding aspects of the Cambridge supervision style of learning, so aim to be flexible and follow your supervisor's guidance.

You're able to propose research topics in almost any subject area. The only limitations are that we can't support projects that require in-person arrangements, such as lab-work, or primary research.





Beyond your Supervisions

While academic research is at the heart of our programme, we're sure you'll also want to make the most of its networking opportunities.

It's your chance to expand your global network and make new friends, so we'll help facilitate online social and networking events for you to meet other programme participants.

We also encourage you to develop your own informal study groups. It's a great way to help structure your week, learn more about other people's research and build friendships.

Then to wrap up the programme, we'll also celebrate some of your research projects in a final event where a small group of you will have the chance to present your findings and share your final reflections.

Programme Support

We'll make sure you're well prepared to start your research.

Before the start of the programme, we'll send you detailed information about the practicalities of completing a research project and you'll be well briefed during academic orientation.

Alongside your supervisor, we'll also assign you a Director of Studies who will help monitor your progress and be available should you need them.

How to Apply

Does the Online Summer Research Programme sound right for you?

We welcome applications from intellectually ambitious students from all over the world.

You apply to our programme through an online form and as part of the application process we'll need you to complete a project form detailing your proposed research on the Open Stream or selecting which Subject Stream and topic you'd like to follow.

You'll also need to make sure your home institution sends us an academic transcript.

We require a minimum GPA of 3.2 or equivalent and that you have finished the first year of your degree course by the start of the programme. It's also important you have a high level of fluency in English and we'll ask to see evidence of this if needed.

We consider applications on a rolling basis, so make sure you apply early.

Once we've received all completed parts of your application, we'll let you know our decision within ten working days.
